Located at the base of the Cascade Mountains near the majestic Lassen Volcanic National Park, Camp Fleischmann is the premier camping facility for Scouts of the Nevada Area Council. For 61 years, campers have grown through immersion in the great outdoors, challenging leadership experiences and exciting physical activities.

Camp Fleischmann was built in the mid-1950s. With close to \$1,041,000 in recent investments and capital improvements, Camp Fleischmann boasts an expansion to its dining facility, improvements to the archery range, shooting range and chapel. Scouts of the Nevada Area Council, as well as Scouts from neighboring councils are grateful to its many benefactors, including the late Mr. Courtney Catron, the Robert Z. # Boy SCOUTS



Led by boys for boys, the Boy Scout program is for boys sixth grade through 18 years old. The Boy Scout program is designed specifically to develop good character, citizenship and personal fitness through appreciation of the outdoors. Guided by the Scout Oath and the Scout Law, Scouting helps boys develop into well-rounded young men. Scouts are ranked in the advancement program by personal achievements, knowledge acquisition, and added responsibilities. Earning merit badges provides opportunities for Scouts to be introduced to lifelong hobbies and rewarding careers. Boys are rewarded with the opportunity to take responsibility for the planning and activities of the troop, and in doing so develop a strong sense of teamwork and learn to lead as well as respectfully follow. Through the support of parents, community and religious organizations, Scouts develop an awareness and appreciation of their integral role in their community.
